



## **2022 UC PPO Plans Pharmacy Coverage Changes**

Effective January 1, 2022, UC will transition management of the UC pharmacy benefit program from Anthem IngenioRx to Navitus Health Solutions (Navitus). This transition affects all UC PPO plan members enrolled in UC Care, UC Health Savings Plan, CORE, UC Medicare PPO and UC High Option Supplement to Medicare. As the new pharmacy benefit manager, Navitus will set clinical policy and guidelines for medications and will process pharmacy claims for these UC PPO plans.

After a thorough review process, a committee representing UC faculty, staff and retirees determined that Navitus would offer significant advantages as the pharmacy benefit manager for these UC plans.

We want to ensure a smooth transition for you, so we'll communicate more details about this change between now and December, including any actions you'll need to take. Register with **anthem.com/ca** to ensure you receive all email communications about the pharmacy benefits change. In the meantime, here is a preview of what you can expect:

- Navitus offers a large retail pharmacy network, including Costco, CVS, Walgreens, Walmart and Safeway/Vons, pharmacies located within University of California (UC) Health medical centers, and many independent pharmacies.
- Mail order services through Costco for convenient home delivery of medications you take regularly. You don't have to be a Costco member to use the mail order pharmacy.
- Online tools to make the most of your prescription benefit, including a drug lookup tool, pharmacy locator, cost compare tool, and educational resources to help you manage your health.
- 24/7 customer care to help answer questions about your benefits and better understand how to take your medications.

## What's Covered and What You Pay

There are no changes to the benefit plan copays or coinsurance levels. However, Navitus uses its own formulary (the list of drugs that are covered by the plan). While the Anthem IngenioRx and Navitus formularies are similar, there are some differences. You'll get more information later in the fall about any impacts to your current prescriptions.
